LOCATION:

Amsterdam, The Hague, London, Belfast, Dublin

DURATION:

Spring semester course
May 20 – June 11, 2018
(Tentative travel)

REQUIREMENTS

Must have minimum of 2.5 GPA, at least second semester freshman status, and be in good disciplinary standing. Must have taken SOCIOLGY 276 or have consent of the instructor.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION: English

COURSE SELECTION:

SOCIOLGY 491 or CRIMJUS 491 3 credits

THE PROGRAM

This course meets during the spring semester, followed by 3 weeks traveling abroad. We will be examining criminal justice systems around the world, with emphasis on comparison to the U.S. system. We will examine specific components of the criminal justice systems, including the policing, courts, corrections, and crimes. The effects of globalization on crime and criminology are quite apparent in the booming numbers of transnational crimes that are committed each year.

This course will enrich the students via intercultural awareness and intercultural experiences, along with being an integrated learning experience.

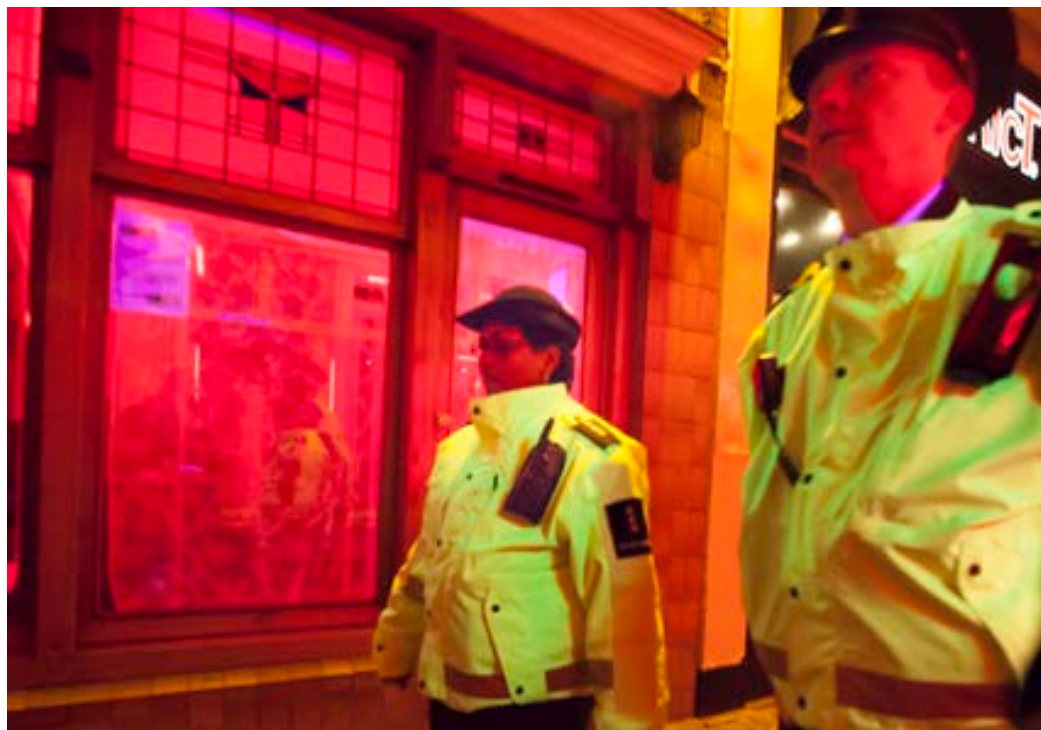
