## THE PROGRAM

Why did so many artists choose to work and live in Paris, the City of Light? In this course, we will explore Paris from a cultural and historical perspective, specifically looking at the reasons Paris provided such a fertile cultural environment for many twentieth-century expatriate writers and artists, such as Ernest Hemingway, Pablo Picasso, Gertrude Stein, and Richard Wright. Beginning with a historical overview of France and Paris, we will also discuss cultural differences and delve deeper into a study of several individual artists and their works. During the travel portion, we will visit the great monuments and cultural highlights of Paris as well as the cafés and other lesser-known treasures frequented by the artists, to get a true feel for the Paris experience and understand the conditions in which these artists lived and worked.

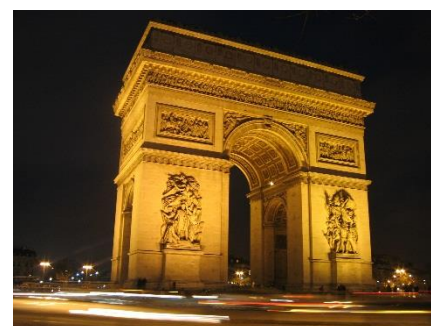
